Milestones

- 1904-5 townspeople of Abertillery wanted a local hospital as nearest hospital was in Newport
- 1918-9 committee established and two sites looked at
- 2 x 22 bedded hospital proposed
- Contributions of 1d for every £1 earned by local people
- Land donated by the Hanbury estate
- Designed by Walter Prosser
- Built by John Henry Morley
- Foundation stone laid 1920
- Hospital opened on 30.9.1922
- 44 beds with major operations, casualty and x ray department. Later, also had a GP clinic on site



- Taken over by NHS in 1948
- Closed in 2008
- Acquired by St Lukes and then Imeus
- Became a low secure ward until closed in March 2018
- Bought by Elysium in June 2018
- 11.5 acres of land with beautiful view of the Welsh countryside



The new service

- 1st ward-Bevan ward- 12 bedded low secure ward for males
- Experienced Hospital director and MDT
- Discharge plan on admission
- Safewards
- 12 week programme
- High quality care
- Outcome focused-improved mental health, reduction of risks, preparation for community living, good physical health management, effective management of behaviour, improved self esteem and self confidence



Outcomes in Forensic Mental Health

- Daily functioning- HONOs
- Problem/symptoms reduction-CORE-10
- Quality of life- patient satisfaction
- Reduction of future recidivism-HCR-20



Forensic Mental Health

- Quality network for forensic mental health – revision and now 95 standard for peer review
- QUAIT- 165 QA standards
- HIW- quality of the patient experience, delivery of safe and effective care and quality of management and leadership
